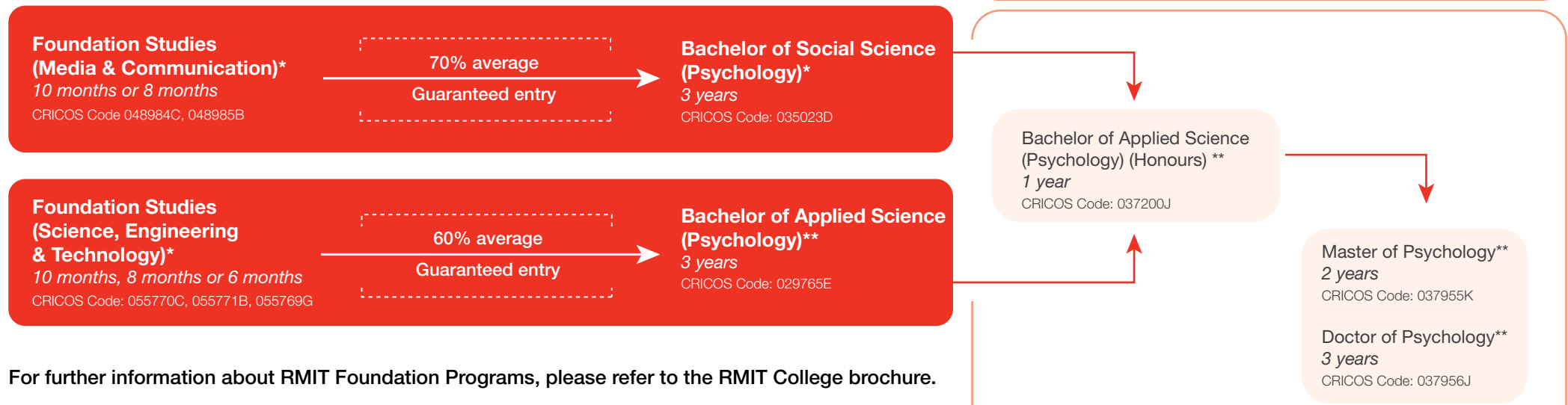


RMIT offers two Bachelor degrees in Psychology. For each degree, there is a Foundation Studies program which provides guaranteed entry if the required results are obtained.

### Professional Accreditation

Both Bachelor programs are accredited by the Australian Psychological Society (APS) and are a partial requirement for membership of the APS and for registration as a psychologist with the Victorian Psychologist's Registration Board. At least three further years of approved study and/or supervised practice are required for membership of the APS and for registration as a psychologist. This requirement can be fulfilled at RMIT by proceeding to the Bachelor of Applied Science (Honours) and the Master of Psychology or Doctor of Psychology.
