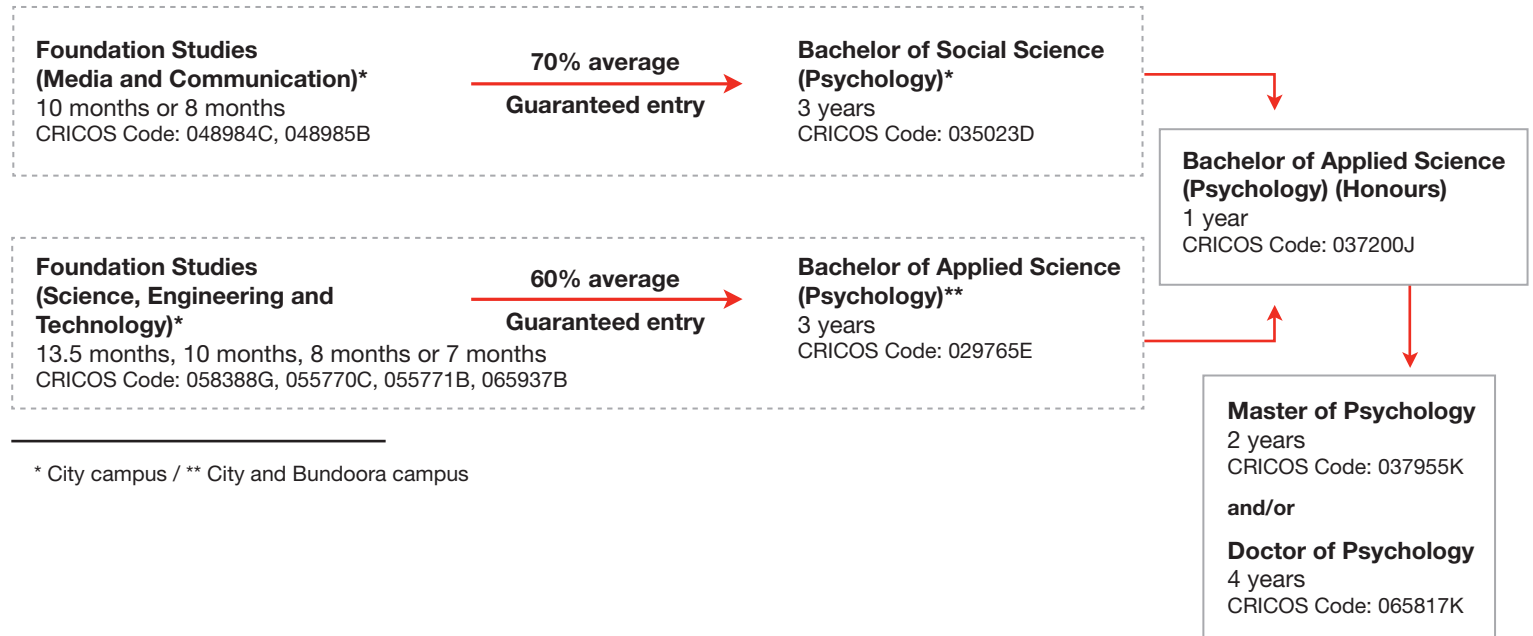


PSYCHOLOGY DEGREE PATHWAYS

Employment Opportunities

Graduates of a psychology degree can obtain employment in a range of areas in the public, private and community sectors, such as human resource management, organisational management, health, welfare, sport, counselling, cross-cultural studies, disability studies, child protection, education and research.

They can also use the degree as a basis for the further study required to become a practising psychologist.

Professional Accreditation

Both bachelor programs are accredited by the Australian Psychological Society (APS) and are a partial requirement for membership of the APS and for registration as a psychologist with the Victorian Psychologist's Registration Board. At least three further years of approved study and/or supervised practice are required for membership of the APS and for registration as a psychologist. This requirement can be fulfilled at RMIT by proceeding to the Bachelor of Applied Science (Honours) and the Master of Psychology or Doctor of Psychology.
