- Cross-campus studies to RMIT Vietnam
- Global Intensives (Study tours)
- International internships – RIIERP
- Study Abroad program
- Exchange Program

Cross-campus studies

- Spend 1 or 2 semesters @ RMIT Vietnam
- 2 campuses and over 7,000 students:
 - Saigon South (Ho Chi Minh City)
 - Hanoi
- Programs in information technology, multimedia systems, business, accountancy, marketing and professional communications, as well as research projects
- Master level programs- MBA and International Business
- Programs taught in English at both campuses
- Trimester system start dates in mid-February, early June or late October
- New Colombo Plan (NCP) Grants*

Global Intensives (Study Tours)

 Organised by RMIT Academic schools (check school's website for details)





Short-Term Programs

- Usually 2 4 weeks over Summer or Winter break
- Receive 12 to 24 credit points
- Organised by partner Universities on an exchange basis, non-partner Universities on a study abroad basis and by third party providers on a fee-forservices basis

RMIT International Industry Experience and Research program (RIIERP)

- Work in a supervised industry placement for 6-12 months
- Available to Undergraduate and Postgraduate students
- 1 application deadline each year (approx. May)
- 165 international companies involved in RIIERP, including such respected names as Airbus, the Siemens Group, Nestle, Volkswagen, BMW, and the Rolls-Royce Group in Europe and North America

Study Abroad program

- Study at a non-partner institution (no agreement)
- Pay tuition fees directly to host institution
- Remain enrolled at RMIT, fee waiver at RMIT
- Organise credits for overseas studies

Exchange program

- Spend 1 or 2 semesters overseas
- More than 180 partner institutions worldwide
- Receive credits for overseas studies no additional time!
- Remain enrolled at RMIT
- Continue to pay tuition fees at RMIT fee waiver at partner institution



Exchange program

Partner grading system

RED

- Very popular destination
- Limited spots available every semester
- Highly competitive academically

AMBER

- Popular destination
- Quite competitive academically
- Some flexibility with spaces available

GREEN

- Less competitive
- Flexibility with spaces available

CLOSED

Partner not accepting applications

You must choose 1 green

Plus an additional green, red or amber




Eligibility for Exchange

- By application time you must have completed at least:
 - 1 year of full time studies (ie, 72-96 credit points) for UG students (including credit transfers)
 - 1 semester of full time studies (ie, 36-48 credit points) for VE, PG and AD students;
 - 1 semester of full time studies (ie, 36-48 credit points) for Cross-campus exchange to Vietnam
- Minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.0
- Must study a full time load on campus while on exchange
- Approval by School/Program Coordinator
- Sufficient funds to finance studies and for time overseas



Costs to consider

- Visa application fee
- Travel and health insurance
- Accommodation
- Food

- Books/materials
- Social life
- Travel



** Budget approximately \$2000 per month

RMIT Student Mobility Grants

- Student can only receive one form of funding per activity.
- There is no application for Exchange and Study Abroad MGs.
 They will be automatically applied if you are eligible.
- For Global Intensives, the Global Intensive leader will apply for funding.
- For other short term programs, you need to submit your application in the month prior to the program start date via Mobi (application assessed 1st of each month)
- Based on academic merit and is very competitive!



John Storey Junior Memorial Scholarships

- Up to \$5,000
- Based on academic merit, community service and extra-curricular activities

Eligibility:

- applying for the exchange program
- must be an Australian citizen or permanent resident
- must be a first time participant
- not eligible if in receipt of any other scholarship or grant



Federal Government Scholarships

- Do not need to apply as RMIT Global Mobility will allocate available funding according to academic merit
- Applicable destinations published on the Global Mobility website

Applicants must be:

- Australian citizens or permanent residents
- Must be studying a full time on campus load at host institution and complete all courses

VE students are not eligible



OS HELP Loan Scheme

- Up to \$6,470 per semester (2016)
- Up to \$7,764 per semester if studying in Asia (plus additional \$1035 if undertaking Asian language study prior)
- Added to HELP debt

Eligibility:

- Must
 - be an Australian citizen
 - be on a Commonwealth supported place
 - be an undergraduate (or postgraduate student)
 - have completed at least 96 credit points of studies (UG)
 - be coming back to at least 12 credit points of studies

Other Financial Support

- RMIT school-based
 - Ask your school if they have any funding available
- Host country/institution
 - Where applicable, scholarship information will be listed on the Exchange partner list on the RMIT Global Mobility (GloMo) website
 - GloMo advisor will nominate student if there is any funding available
- RMIT Equity Travel Scholarships
 - Must submit an application directly to RMIT Scholarships office



Other Financial Support

- Centrelink financial assistance
 - Youth Allowance, Austudy or Abstudy
 - Continue to receive payment if enrolled in a full-time on-campus load at overseas institution
 - May become eligible for Living Away From Home allowance while overseas
- Part-time work (depending on visa regulations)
 - Work up to 20 hours per week in most countries
 - Work on-campus only in the US



Exchange Application process

STEP 1: PLAN & PREPARE

- Understand application procedure (attend info session)
- 2. Research & select courses at partner institution
- 3. Complete your outbound application on Mobi
- 4. Keep up your academic performance
- 5. Start planning your finances

STEP 2: SUBMIT OUTBOUND APPLICATION

Submit outbound application to GloMo by deadline:

Semester 2: 20 December previous year

Semester 1: 20 July previous year



STEP 3: RMIT NOMINATION & GET SET

- 1. GloMo processes and recommends student by email to each partner institution.
- Successful student given information on how to apply to partner institution. Attendance required at Get Set session as advised.

STEP 4: PARTNER INST. APPLICATION

Student complete partner application & submit documents to GloMo to be mailed out to partner inst.



GloMo notifies students of application outcome - eg, offer, acceptance, rejection

STEP 6: PRE-DEPARTURE ARRANGEMENT

- 1. Attend compulsory Pre-Departure Session
- 2. Finalise visa, flights, travel insurance etc.
- 3. Submit Mobility Confirmation Letter to School
- 4. Finalise exchange enrolment





Getting started

- Attend an information session
- 2. Select two partner institutions
- 3. Research the academic and non-academic requirement, eg, will it suit your needs? check campus location, download course descriptions, etc...
- 4. Contact RMIT Global Mobility to discuss your options
- 5. Make an appointment with your Program Coordinator for approval BUSINESS submit your study plan to Business Central by: 20th June/ 20th Nov
- 6. Submit outbound application **ONLINE** via **Mobi**



Outbound application

- Online Mobi application
- Approved Study Plan
- Two host preferences
- Details of an academic referee (name, phone, email)
- Copy of passport

Exchange Deadlines

- RMIT Semester 1 20 July (previous year)
- CoB study plan deadline 20 June
- RMIT Semester 2 20 December (previous year)

CoB study plan deadline 20 Nov

Cross-Campus Studies to Vietnam

- Vietnam Trimester 1 (start mid-Feb) 1 Nov (previous year)
- Vietnam Trimester 2 (start early June) 1 March
- Vietnam Trimester 3 (start late Oct) 1 July
