Teaching methods

RMIT University acknowledges challenges faced by industry to release staff for training and now offers the Diploma of Logistics through Open Universities Australia. This offering provides a semi structured study plan over four study periods which allows for some self-paced learning to occur during the study period. All delivery and assessment resources and activities are available online and a facilitator is allocated to each student to provide learning support as required. The facilitator will play a key role in ensuring the student remains on track and where possible, mentored by an industry professional. This method of delivery allows students to study in their own time in any location and learn from a blended learning model.

Students are required to spend three hours in the online virtual classroom plus up to eight hours personal study/assignments per week for each unit.

- » Complement “on-the-job” experience, knowledge and skills with practical learning to meet the challenges of an increasingly complex global business environment

Assessment

Assessment will be individual activities and assignments. Where possible, these will be contextualised to the work environment to maximise transfer of learning.

The program consists of 14 units as follows:

Develop and evaluate strategies for transport and logistics enterprises (TLIP5011A)

Develop a transport and logistics business plan (TLIP5004A)

Operational Management

Manage operational plan (BSBMGT515A)

Manage budgets and financial plans (TLIP5035A)

Manage suppliers (TLIR5014A)

Develop and maintain operational procedures for transport and logistics enterprises (TLIL5020A)

People Management

Manage customer service (TLII5018A)

Manage a supply chain (TLIL5055A)

Manage industrial relations (BSBWRK509A)

Provide leadership across the organisation (BSBMGT605B)

Environmental Management

Ensure a safe workplace (BSBOHS509A)

Conduct environmental audits (TLIU5006A)

Manage risk (BSBRK501A)

Develop workplace policy and procedures for sustainability (TLIU4010A)

Entrance requirements

There are no formal entrance requirements however previous work experience and /or interest in working in the logistics industry sector is highly desirable.

Articulation and pathways

There are pathways into related RMIT programs once you have graduated.

Graduates may apply for exemptions for up to eight courses from the following degrees:

- » Bachelor Business (Logistics and Supply Chain Management)
- » Bachelor Business (Logistics and Supply Chain Management)—Applied

Note: In TAFE, RMIT University recognises and accepts any Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) qualifications and Statements of Attainment that are issued by other Registered Training Organisations (RTOs). Credit will therefore be given for modules or units of competency for which an original official certificate or Statement of Attainment is produced.
