

COPYRIGHT QUICK GUIDE

Radio, radio podcasts and satellite programs

Recoding from radio and satellite

The Screenrights Licence allows you to record from radio and satellite radio. There is no limit as to how much you can record. Copies of recorded programs can be placed online and also provided to students on CD/DVD. Each copy must contain the [require marking notice](#).

Digital copies can be created by either recording in a digital form or by digitising analogue recordings. The RMIT University Library – [Audio Visual Services](#) can assist with digitising, and also assist with sourcing recordings in a digital format.

Downloading podcasts of radio programs

The Screenrights licence allows downloads of free-to-air broadcasts [podcasts]. Before downloading a podcast from the internet you must ensure that the program you wish to use has first been broadcast on, radio or satellite and the program must be offered as a downloadable podcast by the broadcaster. The [Electronic Use Notice](#) must be shown before the podcast is played.

Content that has been created exclusively for the internet and has never been broadcast on radio or satellite is outside the scope of the Screenrights license. Permission must be sought from the copyright holder for podcasts created exclusively for the internet. Alternatively if the program is available via the copyright holder's website you can link to or embed the program.

Placing online, blackboard, Moodle, teaching technologies

The Screenrights licence allows programs recorded from radio or downloaded free-to-air broadcasts [podcasts] to be uploaded to teaching technologies or alternatively placed into the [Learning Repository](#). The required [Electronic Use Notice](#) must be shown before the program is screened.

Marking

Analogue notice

For analogue recordings such as video VHS, the below notice must be placed onto the analogue tape and its container.

For all digital copies including podcasts, the below notice must be placed onto digital work.
